Western Hudson Bay is home to the largest summer population of belugas in the world, estimated at 55,000



CPAWS is working to conserve a huge portion of Hudson Bay to help protect belugas and other animals who live in Canada's great inland sea



Belugas have a lifespan of 60–70 years



They can grow up to 5m in length and weigh up to 1,500kg



They eat a varied diet of small fish and crustaceans such as Arctic cod, capelin, and shrimp



Just like dolphins, belugas use sound and echolocation to communicate, navigate and search for food
